STATE VICE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Once again! It's up to you to save!

ow and behold 2018 is here, and it's already March. Tax Day is right around the corner! Yes, it is tax time, and many of you will be making contributions to their qualified account with the hope of lowering your taxable income. As we have done in previous years, I feel it is important to share some information as per how much you may be able to contribute. Remember, this information is general, and we advise you to contact your tax professional and discuss what is in your best interest. You may or may not qualify to make deductible contributions, you might make to much money, or you might not make enough. So, call your accountant or CPA to verify what you can and can not do...

In finding the following limits, I visited www.irs.gov to acquire the information for each Retirement Plan and Qualified Plan limit. Remember, you have until April 17, 2018, to contribute to your IRA and Roth IRA for 2017 (this is referred to as a "carry back contribution." The 2017 IRA carry back contribution limit is \$5,500 for age 49 and below, while the 2017 carry back contribution limit for age 50 and above is \$6,500. The good news is, Roth IRA carry back contribution limits are the same. So, for age 49 and below \$5,500 is the 2017 carry back contribution while age 50 and above enjoy a \$6,500 carry back Roth IRA contribution limit for 2017.

In 2018, the IRA & Roth

IRA contribution limits will remain the same as the 2017 limits. For age 49 and below the contribution limit is \$5,500 for 2018 while age 50 and above contribution limit for 2018 is \$6,500.

Moving on, the contribution limits for a 401(k) did change a little. The contribution limit is \$18,500 if you are 49 or below. If you happen to be 50 or above, you may contribute up to \$24,500 into your 401(k) for 2018 (this is known as a "catch up" contribution as well).

Educators, nurses, and doctors may have access to make contributions to a 403(b) account. If so, the contribution limit for 2018 also changed to \$18,500 if you are 49 or younger, while if you are age 50 and above your 2018 contribution limit is

\$24 500

In summary, we saw some small changes in contribution limits between 2017 and 2018. Before contributing, make sure you have reviewed your contribution plan with your Accountant/CPA. IRA headaches are never fun, and a little homework can go a very long way come tax time.




A Prayer for Daily Repentance

Question:

I have been contacted by a pipeline company that says it has the right to "take" my land by eminent domain. What can I do and what are my rights?

Believe it or not many Texans are affected by eminent domain and the condemnation process at

some time in their lives because of a pipeline crossing their property, the expansion of an adjacent road or highway or, now, maybe even a border wall, if you live in South Texas!


'Eminent Domain" refers to the inherent right of the government to take private property for a public use. Private entities also may have the power of eminent domain if allowed by the law and if their project is considered a public use. Sometimes you will hear the term "Condemnation." "Condemnation" is the legal process and procedure used by public or private entities with the power of eminent domain for the taking of a landowner's land. The Fifth Amendment of the U.S. Constitution and Article I, Section 17, of the Texas Constitution provide for and guarantee that a property owner will receive just compensation for

the taking. If the government/ private company (Condemnor) and Landowner cannot reach an agreement on compensation, then, "just compensation" is determined judicially through the condemnation process established by The Condemnor only has the right to take the property for a public use and only the amount needed for that public use. Legitimate public uses include public roads, parks, libraries and utility projects. Many other private projects have also been deemed "for the public use" often include -oil and gas pipelines, high voltage power lines, meter stations, drainage canals and water lines or canals. If your land is going to be taken by the government or private company in condemnation. You are entitled to certain timely notices and information throughout the condemnation process. The Condemnor must appraise the property it plans to take to determine fair compensation. Further, the Condemnor must provide you with the appraisal and make you an offer. You don't have to accept the initial offer. If you choose to decline the offer, the Condemnor must continue the process of condemnation which includes the appointment of special commissioners, a commissioners' hearing and award of compensation and possible trial proceeding, if the commissioners' award is rejected by either party. However, once an award of compensation is deposited by the Condemnor with the court, typically the Condemnor may access your property and begin the project, even before just and adequate compensation has been determined by the Court.

Although most Landowners would like to stop or avoid an eminent domain project altogether, in most cases that option is not available. However, if a condemnation project is not for a "legitimate public use" then that project could be stopped or prevented.






KJT Society #40, East Bernard

Bessie Kocian in the Beasley community in Lavaca County, Texas on December 15, 1933.

The couple was united in marriage in Immaculate Conception Catholic Church in Panna Maria, Texas by Bishop John Morkovsky, uncle of the bride, on September 28, 1957.

Shortly after graduating high school John was drafted into the U.S. Army, taking his infantry training at Camp Hood, Texas. He served with the 40th Infantry Division in the Philippine Invasion campaign. While training in amphibious landings for the invasion of the Japanese mainland, the war abruptly ended. Five days

after the armistice was signed the Soviet Union invaded the northern portion of the Korean Peninsula. Immediately, the 40th Division was sent to the southern portion, where a military government was established. Army personal supervised selected Korean officials in each province to ensure the smooth formation of the democracy. John stated, "I felt good to have had a part, however small, in creating a

prosperous, productive and peaceful South Korea."

After discharge, John helped run the family farm, then began his career with Humble Oil and Refining Company (now Exxon) in 1952.

Mary grew up in Panna Maria, Texas where her father was principal of the elementary school. After graduation from Karnes City High School, she attended Incarnate Word College in San Antonio and earned her degree in Elementary Education.

She taught in the Beeville and Karnes City Elementary schools systems prior to marriage.

John and Mary began their married lived in a small home in a company housing campsite in deep South Texas ranch country, fifty miles south of Falfurrias. Mary had opportunities to teach in small community schools within twenty miles of the campsite namely, Encino

and San Isidro. Eventually, with better roads, the company elected to close the campsite and the employees moved to Falfurrias on February 6, 1962. Mary then decided to leave teaching and become a devoted homemaker and nurturer of their young son.
